These accreditations increase students' chances of obtaining scholarships, landing better jobs, and gaining acceptance in local and international graduate schools.

TUITION

FEES

Undergraduate tuition is charged at a fixed rate based on 12 credits

Any credits above 12 are free with a maximum of 18 credits allowed per semester. Students taking fewer than 12 credits, or those enrolled in summer courses, are charged on a per-credit basis.

With more than US\$80 million allocated for financial aid and scholarships in the upcoming academic year, LAU is committed to helping students fund their education.

Financial aid, grants and scholarships are given based on the financial needs and academic qualifications of applicants, regardless of their nationality, race, gender, religion or ethnicity. Your child can receive a combination of financial aid and scholarships covering up to 100 percent of tuition.

We encourage your child to apply for financial aid and scholarships as early as possible.

All aid and scholarships are renewable as long as certain grades and credit-load conditions are met.

Below is a list of financial aid and scholarships that can be combined in order to cover all or part of your child's tuition.

SCHOLARSHIPS	
National Council for Scientific Research Scholarship	> Covers 100 percent of tuition and provides students with a monthly stipend > Awarded to the top five Lebanese students in each section of the official Lebanese Baccalaureate exam
Merit Scholarship	> Covers 100 percent of tuition > Awarded to students with excellent grades in school and on their SAT exams
LAU Scholarships	 Covers between 25 and 50 percent of tuition Available to students with very high scores on: The official Baccalaureate exam The SAT exam School grades
COMPETITION-BASED & OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS	
Athletic Scholarship	> Covers 15 percent of tuition > Awarded to students demonstrating athletic talent
LAU Awards	> Covers between 10 and 50 percent of tuition > Granted to students who have won any of the LAU competitions: MUN, MAL, MEU, MAU, MGG, Arts & Sciences, Architecture, Engineering, etc.
FINANCIAL AID	
LAU Grants	> Funding that students are not required to pay back
Special Donors' Grants	> Awarded by external donors > Available to students who fulfill eligibility criteria
US Federal Loans	> Available to students who are US citizens or green card holders
